
Juneteenth commemorates the freedom of more than 250,000 enslaved Black people in the state of Texas. Juneteenth is now observed as a national holiday annually on June 19, celebrating the emancipation of those enslaved in the United States.

Absolute Equality public art initiative will serve as a national platform for highlighting and amplifying the story of Juneteenth and help give voice to the voiceless while remembering and celebrating the contributions of Black freedmen and formerly enslaved people who fought for their freedom and the freedom of others.

Absolute equality is about cultivating a culture within society that supports the belief that everyone deserves the freedom to pursue the opportunity to become their very best selves to the benefit of the collective community.



Summary



Absolute Equality will reimagine an approach to public art, monuments, and memorials to reflect the nation's diversity better and highlight a story that was extensively buried or marginalized until 2021, Juneteenth. The Absolute Equality national mural initiative will give form and narrative to the beautiful, extraordinary, and powerful multiplicity, representative of one of America's most influential and essential stories of emancipation and liberty, Juneteenth.

After the wake of Juneteenth becoming a national holiday in 2021, public artist, Reginald C. Adams envisioned a national initiative where similar public art mural installations across America could be implemented to expand the awareness of the historical heritage of Juneteenth and the pursuit of "Absolute Equality".

 - teams of professional artists and local community stakeholders will influence the design and production of site-specific public art mural installations in ten unique communities across America.

Each installation will be guided by a toolbox of historical information, reference images, and media content to help inform their own evolutionary narrative of Juneteenth and the pursuit of Absolute Equality in America. These public art projects will transform communities into cultural and artistic landmarks.

Community Engagement

Highly interactive website and augmented reality applications will be developed for each local mural project.

Hands-On Engagements

Local youth and residents will work alongside professional artists to assist in the co-creation of the murals.

Documentary Film & Media Content

Absolute Equality, a documentary film, will be a 30 minute motion-picture intended to document the production of the mural, highlight community partners and depict the history of Juneteenth.

Benefits

The benefits of this public art initiative come in the form of economic growth, cultural literacy, cultural identity, and placemaking. The local stories, local artists, and community leaders from these 10 communities will inspire and influence site specific murals that highlight Juneteenth and the pursuit of Absolute Equality.

Public art helps express a community's history and heritage and creates an elevated sense of awareness of the values of the community for residents and visitors.




Cultural Identity
